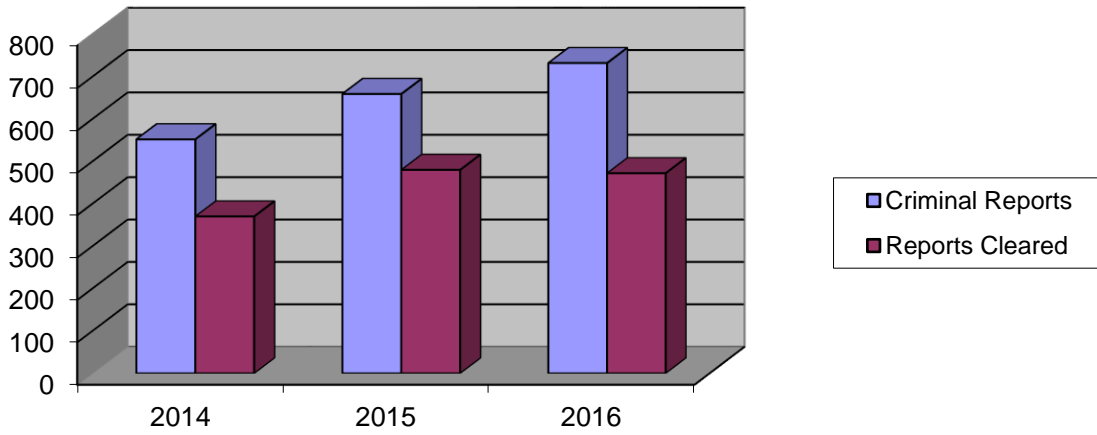

In September 2016, Sgt. Tom Posey along with VIPS members participated in the Children's Fair held at SYC where backpacks, water bottles, stickers, and coloring books along with other informational items were handed out.

Rachel's Challenge Field Day

The Buckhannon Police Department continued to partner with Buckhannon Upshur High School and the Rachel's Challenge Kindness club to sponsor educational activities for participating children at this event. The activities focused on alcohol and drug education.



UCare Pool Parties

This is a partnership the Department has with various community agencies to help reduce underage drinking and raise awareness to the issue. Officers chaperone the events which are held at the high school. The goal is to give middle school and high school children a safe and fun alternative to abusing alcohol.

National Night Out

The Buckhannon Police Department hosted the annual National Night Out event at the Upshur County pool in August 2016. This event was attended by several hundred people where officers were able to make positive connections with a wide variety of people.



Halloween Safety

The Police Department took the Halloween Safety program to all preschool - 2nd grade students in the City of Buckhannon. Officers taught the participants how to remain safe while Trick or Treating by utilizing what they have learned about “Stranger Danger” and “Pedestrian Safety”. In 2016, the program reached over 600 students. Chief Gregory and Lt. Loudin utilized the Halloween Safety Neighborhood to present the program.

Trunk or Treat

Thanks to the efforts of PFC Darin Hissam, the Buckhannon Police Department held a trunk or treat event that saw over 500 area children participate.

Red Ribbon Week

In 2016 City Officers assisted in spreading the message of Red Ribbon Week across Upshur County. Red Ribbon Week is an outreach program aimed at educating the community, specifically school aged children, on the dangers of drug use. It encompasses educational activities and presentations given by officers. The Police Department’s goal is to show the effects of drug use on the student’s health and the legal repercussions that they could face.

Chief Matt Gregory and Doug Loudin teamed up with CJ Day for a drug awareness presentation at the Buckhannon Upshur Middle School during this event.

Head Start staff training

As an extension of the Buckhannon Police Department's partnership in education with Upshur County Head Start, training was provided to Head Start employees about drug awareness / safety. This training was attended by about 20 employees.

Volunteers In Police Service

The Buckhannon Police Department continued to recruit members into the VIPS program, holding a training class for new members in the Spring.

Guest Speaking at West Virginia Wesleyan

Lieutenant Doug Loudin and Ptlm. Marshall O'connor spoke to multiple classes at WVWC. They discussed how impaired driving and the effects of alcohol on a person's body.

Community issues were also discussed at one of the fraternities.

Training for Corhart employees

In October and December, PFC Wilson provided training to employees at Corhart focusing on highway safety issues.
